10: 30	Yamanashi	Lake Kawaguchi free time + seasonal limited itinerary 1) Free activities at Lake Kawaguchi - overlooking Mt. Fuji (about 30 minutes) Lake Kawaguchi is the lake with the longest shoreline among the Fuji Five Lakes. Cherry blossoms in spring, tulips in summer, and red leaves in autumn make the place change with different styles according to the seasons. 2) Seasonal limited itinerary--Special plan to see the four seasons changes of Mt. Fuji (you can have free lunch here, lunch expenses are at your own expense) ▼Lake Kawaguchi Oishi Park (November 24-April 14 and May 29-July 10; approximately 60 minutes) Every spring, it is the most classic spot to take photos with Mt. Fuji and cherry blossoms Every summer, the lavender in Oishi Park on the shore of Lake Kawaguchi is in full bloom, covering the park with a purple carpet, which contrasts with the scenery of Mt. Fuji and is breathtakingly beautiful. This is also the venue for the Kawaguchiko Herb Festival. (Lavender from late June to mid-July) ▼Lake Motosu Fuji Shibazakura Festival (April 15-May 28; approximately 60 minutes) This is the largest Shibazakura Festival in the metropolitan area. It is held regularly every year. It is the largest scale of Shibazakura in Japan's metropolitan area. About 800,000 shibazakura bloom on the vast plains under Mt. Fuji. The colors are bright and beautiful. It is a festival of flowers. For more than a month from April to late May every year, the largest 800,000 Shibazakura trees gradually bloom on the shores of Lake Kawaguchi in Yamanashi, like a "rainbow on the ground." The gorgeous Shibazakura trees, the blue sky and the white snow on Mt. Fuji form an excellent and fascinating scenery. A food festival will also be held. Tickets for the Fuji Shibazakura Festival are 1,200 yen. Children aged 3-12 are 600 yen. Please pay for your own admission. ▼Kawaguchiko Music Forest Museum (July 11-October 19; approximately 60 minutes) The museum is located on the shore of Lake Kawaguchi. While admiring the spectacular Mt. Fuji, you can travel through time and space and appreciate the music box loved by European aristocrats and the healing sounds of automatic instruments. Together with the beautiful gardens, rich natural scenery and healing music, let's take a trip that feels like being on a European trip! Tickets for the Music Forest Museum are 1,800 yen for adults on weekdays, 1,300 yen for high school students, 1,000 yen for elementary and junior high school students, 2,100 yen for weekends and holidays, 1,600 yen for high school students, 1,000 yen for elementary and junior high school students, special fares from August 10 (Saturday) to August 18 (Sunday), 2,300 yen for adults, 1,800 yen for high school students, 1,000 yen for elementary and junior high school students. , please pay for your own admission to the museum (Kawaguchiko Music Forest Museum is closed every Tuesday and Wednesday. If Kawaguchiko Music Forest Museum is closed, it will be changed to Kawaguchiko Konohana Museum or other museums) ▼Kawaguchiko Maple Leaf Corridor (October 20-November 23; approximately 60 minutes) The contrast between the snow-capped Fuji and the fiery red maple leaves is a sight you don't want to miss. This rare event once a year is waiting for your participation and visit. The shores of Lake FujiKawaguchi are colorfully decorated with red maples, and the magnificent golden autumn scenery is mesmerizing. Seasonal dates and attraction availability may vary each year depending on flower conditions, weather, and official operating schedules. The final seasonal itinerary will be confirmed at the time of booking.
13: 20	Yamanashi	▼Internet celebrity check-in resort-Arakurayama Sengen Park-the perfect location to enjoy the panoramic view of Mt. Fuji (about 1 hour) This is the winter-season route (October 1-April 25) The dates may be adjusted each year according to the actual season, weather, flower conditions, and official operating schedules. It goes to Arakurayama Sengen Park and does not go to Mt. Fuji 5th station. The new Internet celebrity attraction is known as one of the "21 places that photographers around the world must visit before they die." Here is Fuji viewing it is an excellent location for a panoramic view of the mountain. If you climb the 397 steps near the main shrine, the five-story Churei Pagoda will come into view. You can take photos of the "five-story pagoda, Mt. Fuji, and the street view at the foot of the mountain" all at once. Photographers and tourists from all over the world People come here to see not only the cherry blossoms in spring, but also the fresh greenery in summer, red leaves in autumn, and snowy scenery in winter. In addition to enjoying the stunning view of Mt. Fuji, you can also overlook the charming streets of Fujiyoshida City. ▼Mt. Fuji 5th station (about 40 minutes) (This is the summer-season route (April 26-September 30)) The dates may be adjusted each year according to the actual season, weather, flower conditions, and official operating schedules, going to the fifth station of Mt. Fuji and not going to Arakurayama Sengen Park). See Mt. Fuji from a closer distance! Mt. Fuji fifth station (Fifth station) (The fifth station of Mt. Fuji is located halfway up Mt. Fuji, with an altitude of 2,305 meters. This highest mountain in Japan has different moods from a distance and up close. Looking up at the top of the mountain from the closest distance to Mt. Fuji, you can feel the majestic beauty. When the weather is clear and cloudless, you can overlook the surrounding scenery, Lake Kawaguchi, etc... at a glance. When the clouds are shrouded, you can overlook the magnificent sea of clouds.
14:40	Yamanashi	▼Soak in the hot springs at Lake Yamanaka and see Mt. Fuji (Free time: 70 minutes) Lake Yamanaka is the only lake among the Fuji Five Lakes with a natural river outflow. It is also the largest and shallowest lake among the five lakes (only 13.3 meters). Mt. Fuji, which can be seen from Lake Yamanaka, has long ridges drawn to the left and right, and it looks very charming. Swans are called white birds in Japan. Every year from February to April, even in the severe cold, swans will fly here to lay eggs and give birth. Because tourists often feed them, the swans sometimes make a special trip to get close to the tourists. Therefore, Lake Yamanaka is also called the "Lake of White Birds." On June 22, 2013, it was recognized as a World Cultural Heritage as part of "Mt. Fuji - the source of faith and art". Recommended activities (at your own expense): ● Yamanakako KABA amphibious bus: JPY 2,800 ● Yamanakako Swan Boat: JPY 1,200 If you choose a hot spring experience, transportation by the same vehicle will be provided. Admission fees, towel fees, meals, and all other hot spring-related expenses are not included. Yamanakako Hot Spring Benifuji-no-YuEnjoy a relaxing bath with views of Mt. Fuji. The fee is approximately JPY 1,300 for adults, JPY 1,100 for guests under 18, and JPY 750 for children under 12.Benifuji-no-Yu is closed every Monday and Tuesday. On those days, we recommend Ishiwari-no-Yu Hot Spring in Hirano, Yamanakako. The weekday admission fee is approximately JPY 1,300.Opening days, operating hours, and fees are subject to change. Please refer to the official websites for the latest information.

- 1) Pickup and Meeting Point

- 2) During the Tour
